

That took away the fun of surprising her with a new one, but it seemed like a good option. I looked forward to her coming to our house and choosing but just a day before she was to arrive. I remembered the 3 bins in the basement of things I saved to give to each of our children from their childhoods. Wonder if there's a blankie in there?

There was! My grandma had crocheted Dominique a white blankie with a pink border before she was born, and it is still in beautiful shape. With her mommy's permission, I offered Olivia the blankie that her great-great grandma had made, and let her know that if she wanted, a really nice lady from the church is ready to

make her a new one. She took hold of her mommy's blanket and it has been wrapped over her shoulders in the cool of the evening and tucked in her bed each night ever since.

There's something about a blanket that warms you, that offers comfort, and reminds you that you're loved.

I just visited one of the saints of our church who had a prayer shawl covering her lap. She has several and particularly enjoys the brightly colored ones that seem joyful and happy. She appreciates their warmth when it's a little cool, and she appreciates knowing that they were made in prayer and with love. There's something about the prayer shawls that warm you, that brings you comfort, and reminds you that you're loved.

Today I'm thankful for all who deliver well-wishes, prayers and love to those who are sick or hurting or in need. I'm thankful for our many "prayer warriors" who are ready to respond, to intercede, to lift up those who are hurting and going through difficult times. 
