dens. I remember she and my Grandpa walking through their yard with me, showing me all the treasures they'd plant-

ed. They were obviously delighted with the beauty! Why wouldn't Grandma pick Spring or Summer as her favorite, since she so loved what came as a result of her labor of love?

Fall wasn't so impressive to me in my younger years, but things have changed! I'm amazed at its beauty just like my Grandma was! The colors have been late appearing this year, but they are spectacular in some places. Whenever I see those electrically-charged leaves, it triggers a thankful response in me.
