A Note from Pastor Toni

Dear Friends,

When I flip the calendar over to November, "gratitude" is the word that comes to mind. I think there are a lot of reasons for that. Here are just a few:

First, it's Fall, and it is amazingly beautiful outside. Spring has always been my favorite season, but Fall is working its way to the top. Scott is red/green color-blind, and it has only been a few years that I've realized that his lack of enthusiasm for the changing leaves is because he can't see them. To him, they're all a shade of brown. I try to describe what I see so that he can "see" it too, but, I know I can't come close to describing the beauty. I've seen some newfangled glasses on Facebook that seem to be able to fix that...maybe someday we can check those out. But, I'm grateful for the season, for its beauty, and the fact that I'm able to see it, especially as I realize that not everyone can.

Monday morning we got our work assignment and the rains began. After driving to our work assignment we determined it was raining too hard to begin our work so we went back to the settlement and enjoyed a few rounds of dominoes. The afternoon brought sunshine so we drove the 15 minuet drive to the home of Jackie Evans in Clairfield, TN (our work assignment for the week)

We took off the old siding and installed blue foam board and then new vinyl siding to two sides of the house. At the request of Jackie, we also closed up one window and painted the front door. The siding for the remaining two sides is scheduled to be completed next spring.

Tuesday, November 29 at 9:00 a.m. - Holiday decorating will take place,


starting in the Fellowship Hall. Volunteers are needed!
